

# Mary Kom enters final in India Open Boxing

Guwahati, May 24: Six-time world champion Mary Kom overcame some stiff resistance to beat promising Nikhat Zareen in a split decision to enter the women's 51kg category final, while the men pugilists dominated the ring by making it an all-Indian gold-medal clash in seven categories in the India Open here Thursday.

In the most-anticipated bout of the day, 22-year-old former world junior champion Nikhat of Telangana was at her aggressive best against her "idol" Mary Kom who was happy to play the waiting game before taking the upper hand in the third round to win 4-1.

The 36-year-old Mary Kom, who was making her competitive debut at home in 51kg, took some

blows initially but was quick to make amends as Nikhat was not able to connect her punches as the bout progressed.

Using her vast experience, Mary Kom regained her composure and dealt a few telling blows on the Strandja Memorial gold winner Nikhat and that seemed to have clinched the issue in favour of the London Olympics bronze medalist Manipuri in the third round. Mary Kom will face Vanlal Duati of Mizoram in the gold-medal bout on Friday.

In the men's section, 17 Indians stormed into the final in 10 weight categories.

Continuing his dream run, former world youth champion Sachin Siwach registered an upset win over reigning Commonwealth Games

champion Gaurav Solanki in a unanimous decision to set up a 51kg gold medal clash against Asian Games gold medalist Amit Panghal.

A day after he eliminated World Championship bronze medalist Rogan Ladon in a well-calculated bout, the 20-year-old from Haryana had his task cut out against his sparring partner but he again emerged victorious.

Panghal, who had clinched a gold in his new weight category in the Asian Championship, defeated national champion P L Prasad in the second 52kg semifinal. Panghal had won the Asian Games gold in Jakarta last year in 49kg.

Shiva Thapa also remained on course to clinching a gold at the same venue where he was crowned national

champion three years ago as he fended off a strong challenge from his Polish opponent D Krystian Szczepanski to emerge 5-0 winner. He will face Manish Kaushik in the 60kg final.

There was also a setback in store for India in the men's 75kg category, when Manjeet Panghal twisted his knee in the first round to be knocked out by his Filipino opponent Eumir Felix Delos Santos.

Santosh will face Ashish Kumar in the final.

Former Asian champion Chatchai Decha Butdee of Thailand also created an upset in the men's 56kg by ousting former World Championship bronze medalist Gaurav Bidhuri in a unanimous decision. The Thai will take on Kavinder Singh Bisht in the final.

# A snapshot of the 11 venues that will host the matches

The ICC World Cup Cricket Tournament will begin in England on May 30 with a match between hosts England and South Africa at The Oval in London. The event will be kicked off by an 'Opening Party' on The Mall in front of Buckingham Palace on May 29. Given below is a brief description of the venues that will host the matches amongst the 10 teams in the fray.

## TRENT BRIDGE

First opened in 1841, Trent Bridge is a truly historic cricket ground. It first hosted a one-day international in 1974 and has been used as a Cricket World Cup venue for the 1975, 1979, 1983 and 1999 editions.

At the ICC Cricket World Cup 2019 it will host five matches, including England v Pakistan. Hosts England have a great record at Trent Bridge, having won both their previous World Cup games at the venue: wins against New Zealand in 1975 and Zimbabwe in 1999.

Trent Bridge, which is the home of Nottinghamshire - was the venue where England set a record ODI score of 481/6, with Alex Hales and Jonny Bairstow both making centuries. It was also the ground where they previously set the record in 2016, when they scored 444/3.

## DURHAM

England's most northerly ground, the home of Durham Cricket, will host three fixtures at the ICC Men's Cricket World Cup 2019.

First established in 1995, The Riverside Durham has previously hosted four ICC Cricket World Cup fixtures, all of which took place at the 1999 edition.

At the ICC Cricket World Cup 2019, Durham will host three fixtures, including England v New Zealand and it will be the home for two Sri Lanka games.

The highest World Cup total at the home of Durham Cricket is 261/6, which was scored by Pakistan on their way to victory against Scotland in 1999. However, the stars of the show that day were the bowling attack of Wasim Akram, Shoaib Akhtar and Abdul Razzaq who took three wickets apiece.

## THE OVAL

The Oval will host five fixtures at the ICC Cricket World Cup 2019, including the opener between England and South Africa.

Set just a stone's throw from the River Thames, the Oval - home of Surrey County Cricket Club - was the scene for the first-ever Test match on English



soil between England and Australia in 1880 and has gone on to host over 100 Tests since.

It has also played host to a number of big World Cup matches, with ten fixtures taking place at the Oval across the 1975, 1979, 1983 and 1999 editions.

The most recent Cricket World Cup fixture at the Oval saw Pakistan spinner Saqlain Mushtaq take a hat-trick against Zimbabwe in 1999.

## OLD TRAFFORD

Old Trafford, home of Lancashire County Cricket Club, will be the busiest venue at the ICC Men's Cricket World Cup 2019, as it will play host to six games, including a semi-final.

It also will be the venue for the most-watched fixture in international cricket when India take on Pakistan.

The ground itself is no stranger to World Cup cricket having been used in the 1975, 1979, 1983 and 1999 editions of the tournament.

England have played two Cricket World Cup semi-finals at Old Trafford, beating New Zealand by nine runs in 1979, but losing to India by six wickets in 1983.

The ground itself is the second oldest Test venue in England, hosting Tests since 1884, and recently renamed their Pavilion End the 'James Anderson End' after England's leading Test wicket-taker.

## LORD'S

There are few cricket grounds in the world as iconic as Lord's.

First opened in 1814 and home to international cricket since 1884, Lord's has hosted 10 ICC Cricket World Cup fixtures, including the finals of the 1975, 1979, 1983 and 1999 editions.

At the ICC Cricket World Cup 2019, the Home of Cricket will host five fixtures, and will once again be the venue for the World Cup Final.

The highest World Cup total at Lord's was hit on the first occasion it hosted a fixture in the tournament, with England scoring an impressive 334/4 against India back in 1975.

Headingley will once

again play host to some of the world's best cricketers next summer, having been one part of the 1975, 1979, 1983 and 1999 editions of the ICC Cricket World Cup.

It will host four matches at the ICC Men's Cricket World Cup 2019, including England v Sri Lanka, and will be where Afghanistan play two of their round-robin fixtures.

The Windies will also appear at Headingley, where they claimed a heroic Test win against England in 2017.

## HAMPSHIRE BOWL

The Hampshire Bowl will host ICC Cricket World Cup fixtures for the first time in 2019, with five matches taking place at the venue.

It won't be the first time that Hampshire has hosted World Cup cricket though, as fixtures in the 1983 and 1999 editions were played at the old Northlands Road Ground in Southampton.

The Hampshire Bowl, home of Hampshire County Cricket Club, was opened in 2001 and sits on the outskirts of Southampton on the south coast of England.

It has hosted international fixtures in all three formats and was also home to five fixtures in the 2004 edition of the ICC Champions Trophy.

## EDGBASTON

Having been established in 1886, it's fair to say that Edgbaston - home of Warwickshire County Cricket Club - has been the venue for some historic moments, including Brian Lara's knock of 501\*, the highest score by a batsman in first-class cricket.

It has been a venue at four previous ICC Cricket World Cups, and was a semi-final location in the 1979, 1983 and 1999 editions. It will host five games at the ICC Cricket World Cup 2019, including one semi-final and the high-profile meeting of England and India.

Cricket fans will remember Edgbaston's 1999 World Cup semi-final between Australia and South Africa as arguably the greatest-ever ODI. Allan Donald and Lance Klusener were the men at the crease that day, with a mix-up in the middle when the scores were level meaning

Australia progressed to the World Cup final.

TAUNTON

Three ICC Cricket World Cup 2019 fixtures will be held at the County Ground Taunton, home of Somerset County Cricket Club.

Overlooked by the towers of three churches, the County Ground Taunton is one renowned for its character and history.

It has been in use since 1882, and staged one game in the 1983 World Cup and two in 1999, including India's clash with Sri Lanka, where they racked up a huge 373/6.



In 2017, the County Ground Taunton was host to the ICC Women's World Cup, with seven fixtures taking place at the ground.

## CARDIFF WALES STADIUM

The Cardiff Wales Stadium is no stranger to hosting ICC tournaments, having been a venue for the last two editions of the ICC Champions Trophy, as well as the ICC Cricket World Cup in 1999.

At the ICC Men's Cricket World Cup 2019, the Cardiff Wales Stadium - home of Glamorgan County Cricket Club - will host four fixtures, adding to the sole World Cup game played there in 1999.

The first county game held at the ground was in 1967, and their first international fixture was in fact the 1999 Cricket World Cup clash between trans-Tasman rivals Australia and New Zealand.

The Cardiff Wales Stadium has seen some dramatic moments played out in its relatively brief history of hosting international cricket, including Pakistan's semi-final win over England at the ICC Champions Trophy in 2017.

## BRISTOL COUNTY GROUND

Three matches will be played at the Bristol County Ground during the ICC Cricket World Cup 2019.

Those three fixtures will double the number of Men's World Cup games the ground has held, following one in 1983 and two in 1999.

More recently, the Bristol County Ground hosted eight fixtures at the ICC Women's World Cup 2017, including England's dramatic semi-final win over South Africa.

The ground came into existence in 1889, and was bought by none other than WG Grace! Since then, Gloucestershire County Cricket Club have called it home for nearly 130 years.
