

UNDER PRIME MINISTER GRAM SADAK YOJANA Upgrade existing roads: CM to PM

Chief Minister Kamal Nath has urged the Prime Minister Narendra Modi for upgradation of the existing roads in the proposed third phase of Prime Minister Gram Sadak Yojana and also cover the villages and habitations on the basis of 2011 census, which were earlier left out.

They will all be connected to all-weather roads. Kamal Nath met the Prime Minister Narendra Modi at latter's residence at New Delhi today and discussed several important development issues.

The Chief Minister drew attention of the Prime Minister to about 20 major projects related to mineral exploration, which are pending with various departments of the Government of India for approvals and permissions. He



said that if these permissions are granted, state will be able to strengthen its revenue base.

The Chief Minister also urged the Prime Minister to increase the wheat procurement limit to 75 lakh metric tonnes in the state. He said that presently procurement limit has been fixed at 67.25 lakh metric tonnes under the Food and Public Distribution System

while the Government of India had agreed to decide the limit of 75 lakh metric tonnes in February.

This limit was fixed on the basis of the procurement figures of previous 4 years.

Giving details of the status of payment to the workers of MNREGA, Kamal Nath said that till now the approved labor budget under MNREGA

exhausts before January. Due to this, the payment is delayed for 3 to 4 months.

Talking about Bundelkhand and Nimar tribal areas, the Chief Minister apprised the Prime Minister of deficient rainfall the areas due to which farmers and other people are forced to migrate in search of job. To prevent this migration adequate assistance from under MNREGA is needed, he added.

Nath also requested the Prime Minister to open a Center of Regional Center of Indian School of Mines Dhanbad at Singrauli. He informed the Prime Minister said that the Government of India had decided to open this center in 2008. For this, 163.25 acres of land has been allocated by the State Government. This Center should be opened soon, he added.

37-yr-old married woman ends life at RBI Colony

A 37-year-old married woman committed suicide by hanging with the ceiling at her residence in RBI colony under Teelajamalpur police station area on Wednesday; woman tried to commit suicide by jumping into Upper Lake but was rescued last week.

According to police, the deceased was identified as Sanjana Tulsani of RBI Colony and in the morning on Wednesday she was found hanging and was rushed to nearby hospital where she was declared dead.

The deceased was a housewife and her husband works with a private company in MP Nagar area. In the initial investigation police found that on Wednesday morning at

around 10 pm husband of deceased left for work and after an hour he tried to contact her over mobile, but it was found switched off after which he called his mother to check whereabouts of deceased and when she checked she found deceased hanging from the ceiling. She informed her son and deceased was rushed to nearby hospital where she was declared dead.

Police have not found any suicide note and during the investigation it was found that

No suicide note was left by the deceased was heavily depressed for the past few months and on May 21, she left home for market but went to Upper Lake where she tried to commit suicide by jumping into Upper Lake but she was rescued.

Meanwhile, a 50-year-old man was found dead near railway track near Narayan Nagar under Baghsewania police station area on Wednesday. The deceased Bhandas Dhurve was found lying near railway tracks and later when taken to hospital he was declared dead.

Police said that the deceased was heavily addicted to liquor and which caused his death. The body was sent for the post mortem and police have registered a case under section 174 of the CrPC and started further investigation.

Valuables worth ₹1 lakh burgled at Nirmala Kuni

Bhopal: House of an insurance agent at Nirmala Kuni was targeted by miscreants and valuables worth Rs 1 lakh were burgled on Wednesday.

Police said that the victim Rajendra Kunjur along with his family had gone to meet his relative in Chhattisgarh and when he returned on Wednesday afternoon he found the valuables were burgled. A complaint was lodged by the victim with the Baghsewania police and in his complaint, he stated that he along with his family had gone to meet relatives in Chhattisgarh last week and when he returned in the after-

noon on Wednesday he found that the locks were broken and when he entered the house valuables were found burgled.

In the burglary, gold and silver jewelry and hoods were burgled. The victim has claimed that the total loss in the burglary is around Rs 1 lakh. The police have registered a case under sections 457 and 380 of the IPC and have started further investigation.

Police said that the CCTV footage of the nearby installed cameras would be searched in the further investigation. The neighbours were not aware of the burglary. SR

Govt aims for better water supply

Bhopal: With the well-planned efforts of the Government, water is being supplied daily in 258 out of total 378 urban bodies of the State at present. Water was being supplied daily in 193 urban bodies in the year 2018, 206 in year 2017, 179 in 2016, 165 in 2015 and 162 in the year 2014.

The number of urban bodies where water is being supplied on alternate days has come down to 96 from 130. The number of bodies where water is being supplied in a gap of two days has reduced to 28

from 62 and bodies where water supply was being made in a gap of three days has reduced to one from 38.

Urban Development and Housing Minister Jaivardhan Singh has informed that the Government aims at ensuring availability of drinking water in every house through taps in all the urban bodies. He said that drinking water schemes have approved for all 378 urban bodies. Of these, 197 schemes have been completed.

The remaining 181 urban bodies schemes are in various

stages of implementation, which are targeted to be completed by March 2020.

Singh informed that water sources have been marked in such a manner that drinking water is available throughout the year.

The impact of improvement in water supply system was apparent from the drinking water being transported through tankers.

Water is being transported through tankers in only 32 urban bodies in the year 2019-20. SR
