India need all-round game at Oval

Visitors' batsmen will have to step up and perform in order for the team to bounce back in the fourth Test

Not that they need inspiration with the Pataudi Trophy tied 1-1 with two Tests to play, but if the visitors need it, they only need to look within. Changes likely for teams

Undecided combinations, wholesale changes and warm weather. It's all to play for as the two sides head to the fourth Test at The Oval. A look at few talking points...

COMBINATIONS

There is less than 10 hours to go but who makes both XIs is still up in the air. Shardul Thakur could get a look in, R Ashwin may be considered. For England, Chris Woakes may get a chance.

With Jonny Bairstow keeping wickets in place of the absent Jos Buttler, both sides could have multiple changes.

PACER(S) TO REST, ROTATE

Five Tests in six weeks is tough on the players. With the series set to be alive till the final Test, both captains may mull resting one of their frontline pacers (Jasprit Bumrah, Mohd Shami or Mohd Siraj for India and Ollie Robinson or James Anderson for England). They have played all three Tests and the mileage in their legs could mean that they are in the red zone.

WARM AND DRY

As far as the weather is concerned, London is expected to be largely warm and dry for the first four days. Will that tempt the visitors into playing Ashwin? With sun beating down on a historically spin-friendly track, this is the off-spinner's best chance of getting a look in.

As India enter The Oval in search of their second win of the series, the onus remains on the batting unit to put up a total which the bowlers can defend. In the four Tests India have played this summer in England, the middle-order has remained susceptible to deliveries outside off. The indecisiveness showed by Cheteshwar Pujara, Virat Kohli and Ajinkya Rahane at No 3, 4, and 5 can happen to visiting batsmen in England, where the conditions over the past five years happen to be amongst the most difficult for batsmen across the world.

Amid the crushing defeat in Leeds, there were a few positives to take home for India and it happened to be the performances of Pujara and Kohli in the second innings. While the two may still be far away from being considered 'batsmen who have returned to form', there were encouraging signs which were greeted by head coach Ravi Shastri. Someone who rarely shows his emotions in the dressing room, he twice walked out of the coach's

cabin at Headingley with a grin on his face to applaud as Pujara, fought his way back to score 91. More than the runs, the time the No 3 spent in the middle will have reassured the team management. That he was beginning to behind the line of the ball will have ben noticed.

Amidst this, it is impossible to overlook the faith the team management has retained in their under fire batting line-up.

It is a stark contrast to what went on during the 2018 tour, where by the middle of it, few players felt they were just one bad performance away from being benched. Although plenty of noise has been made about Pujara and his strike-rate on this tour, the team management values his presence. It is why they were more than happy to wait for the No 3 to be back spending time in the middle. The visitors believe that when that happens, the rest will automatically fall in place as it would give their No 4 and 5 and 6 more breathing space.

It is over to the batting unit to repay the faith and do what they like doing: rise from the ashes.



Shuttler Kiran finishes No 1 in national trials

SHUTTTLERS Kiran George and Malvika Bansod emerged as the No 1-ranked players in the men's and women's singles category after the selection trials that was conducted by the Badminton Association of India (BAI) at the Gopichand Academy in Hyderabad from August 28 to September 1. With no domestic events for over a year due to the pandemic, the BAI conducted the trials in order to pick teams for the upcoming Sudirman Cup and Thomas & Uber Cup. Based on the rankings and the performances, the national body will soon pick a 10-member team for Sudirman Cup and 20 members for the latter. The Sudirman Cup is scheduled to be held from September 26 to October 3 in Vantaa (Finland) while the Thomas & Uber Cup will be held from October 9 to 17 in Aarhus (Denmark).

A new format was applied in order to conduct the trials, according to BAI. "The new format also ensured both elite and domestic players are provided with adequate opportunities to prove their mettle."

Kiran seems to have grabbed the opportunity with both hands. The 21-year-old, who's No 101 according to BWF rankings, finished ahead of several senior shuttlers, who lacked match-practice but entered with a bucketload of experience. Kiran had last participated in Orleans Masters in March and had beaten the likes of Mark Caljouw (World No 23) and senior counterpart HS Prannoy before bowing out in the pre-quarterfinals. Senior professionals Sameer Verma, Ajay Jayaram were placed second and third, respectively. Subhankar Dey was fifth while Prannoy was eighth out of fourteen players who took part. In the women's category, Aditi was No 2 ahead of Tasnim Mir.

In the women's doubles category, Ashwini Ponnappa and N Sikki Reddy were placed second behind Tanisha Crasto and Rituparna Panda.

PSG FLEX THEIR MUSCLES, IN A DIFFERENT WAY

At some level, the Parisiens are playing a different game. Bankrolled by an oil-rich country, they have obliterated the field by offering rich contracts to free agents. They have picked up Gianluigi Donnarumma, Lionel Messi, Sergio Ramos and Georinio Wijnaldum, all without paying a transfer fee. They did all that and still refused to sell Mbappe, for north of 150 million pounds in the final year of his year contract.

PREMIER LEAGUE STILL THE BIG DADDY

While clubs up and down Europe are still feeling the effects of a Covid-19 market, Premier League sides, thanks in large part to rich and willing owners as well as a gigantic existing TV rights deal, have managed to push the boat out in terms of spending. In all, the English league spent 1.1 billion pounds, comfortably clear of the other big-spending European leagues. Grealish set an English transfer record while Arsenal set their own record for money spent in a single window.

LEGACY PLAYERS HAVE NEW HOMES

Much of elite club football in Europe has been shaped by the fortunes of Messi and Ronaldo over the last 14-15 years. For the first time ever, the Clasico, one of the biggest matches in club football, will have never neither of these two talents since the early part of the noughties. While Real vs Barcelona will always grab eyeballs, the rivalry will perhaps warm down for a bit. Also, where does this leave Barcelona who might have a painful rebuild ahead of them?

HAALAND AND MBAPPE THE NEXT BATTLE

Premium attackers will always go for top dollar: Romelu Lukaku's Chelsea deal is an example. And the next in line will heat up next season when Mbappe will be out of contract at PSG and a specific clause gets activated in Erling Haaland's contract. They are football's next biggest things and with both not even close to hitting their peak years, next year's summer transfer window will be another blockbuster.

Manika, Sathian seek exemption from camp

New Delhi: India's leading table tennis players G Sathian and Manika Batra have reportedly sought an exemption from the national federation TTFI for the national camp beginning in Sonepat on Thursday, making them ineligible for selection for the upcoming Asian Championships as per the new rules. Manika reportedly wants to continue with her training regimen in Pune while Sathian is playing in the Polish league. Both Manika and Sathian had won the mixed doubles title in Hungary last month and also did well in the singles competition. However, TTFI advisor M P Singh said the federation's policies are not player specific and whosoever doesn't turn up for the national camp will not be considered for selection as per the new rules.
