

IndiGo flight tyre bursts, all safe

AIR passengers suffered anxious moments when the Kannur-Hubballi flight experienced a tyre burst while landing at the Hubballi Airport on Monday evening.

The IndiGo ATR 6E-7979 flight, arriving from Kannur in Kerala, was scheduled to land here at 8.03 pm. But because of strong winds and rain, the first attempt was not successful.

After the incident, the runway was blocked for maintenance and was opened for flight operations at 8 am on Tuesday.

LATEST TECH WAS COMMISSIONED ONLY LAST WEEK

To prevent accidents while approaching the runway, the Instrumental Landing System technology was commissioned at the airport only last week.

Hubballi Airport Director Pramod Kumar Thakre said the flight had to make a hard landing because of squally weather and that was the reason behind the tyre burst.

An IndiGo technical team arrived from Bengaluru on Tuesday to repair the aircraft. The tyre was replaced, while other technical issues will be fixed by Wednesday.

The aircraft will not be allowed for passenger traffic till a technical team from the DGCA visits and certifies it, which is likely to take about a week, sources said.

Don't share case info during probe, cops told

EXPRESSING concern over police officers divulging details before the completion of an investigation, in turn affecting trials in cases and hearing of bail pleas, the Karnataka High Court on Tuesday directed the State Government to issue comprehensive directions to all police personnel to ensure that the nature of any investigation, identity, materials recovered, etc., are not revealed to the media before the investigation is completed.

A division bench of Chief Justice Abhay Shreeniwasa Oka and Justice Suraj Govindaraj passed the order after hearing a PIL by H Nagabhushana Rao, who sought direction to police officers not to leak details to the media before an investigation is completed.

Referring to the disclosure of identity of a complainant and accused, the court noted that the purpose will not be served if just a circular is issued to police officers, and unless disciplinary proceedings are initiated against those who would leak details or disclose identity. Therefore, appropriate directions need to be issued to officers in four weeks, the court said.

Before this, the government advocate submitted a circular dated June 11, 2021, issued to officers to abide by service rules, and not to leak any details to the media before completing investigation, and it would be considered 'disobedience' if details are revealed.

Meanwhile, the court orally observed that comprehensive directions should be issued to make every officer aware, and the code of conduct needs to be laid down before police officers, instead of issuing bits and pieces of circular.

Police nab prime accused behind plot to kill producer

JAYANAGAR police, who were investigating the plot to murder Kannada film producer Umaphath and his brother, arrested the accused, Rajendra, at Pokhara in Nepal, on Monday.

A senior police officer supervising the investigation said that another accused, Cycle Ravi, and Rajendra wanted to have a hold in the film industry and were making extortion calls to Umaphath and his brother Deepak. The accused had demanded ₹30 lakh, but later realised that the duo had close proximity with their rivals.

Accordingly, Bombay Ravi and his associates were waiting for Umaphath and Deepak near Jayanagar 7th Block, when police arrested 11 of the associates a few days ago. Meanwhile, Bombay Ravi and Rajesh fled.
