NCLT Approves Kalrock-Jalan Resolution Plan for Jet Airways

Tribunal clarifies that determination of landing slots to Jet will be done by DGCA only

Mumbai: The bankruptcy court on Tuesday approved the resolution plan of Kalrock Capital and entrepreneur Murari Lal Jalan for reviving Jet Airways, almost two years after the defunct airline was admitted under the Corporate Insolvency

Resolution Process (CIRP).

Mumbai bench of the National Company Law Tribunal (NCLT), while allowing the resolution plan in an oral order, directed the successful bidders to get required approvals and licences from relevant authorities within 90 days.

The tribunal presided by judicial members Janab Mohammed Ajmal

and V Nallasenapathy clarified that determination of landing slots to the Jet Airways will be done by the Directorate General of Civil Aviation (DGCA) only, and the plan's approval is subject to getting licences from the relevant departments.

This means the airline will not have historic rights over the landing slots available to Jet Airways before

it was grounded in April 2019.

The Kalrock-Jalan consortium had sought the tribunal's intervention to direct DGCA and the civil aviation ministry to approve the company's historical rights on those landing slots.

Lawyers of Kalrock Capital and Jalan declined to comment on the

matter immediately after the open court session, citing that the order was not uploaded yet.

"Our hard work over the last two years has paid off, and today's order will pave the way for the revival of Jet Airways 2.0," said Jet Airways' resolution professional Ashish Chhawharia who is a recovery and reorganisation partner at Grant Thornton Bharat.

"We will now work together with

the Jalan-Kalrock consortium to facilitate a smooth implementation of the plan in the coming weeks," he said.

"The airline has been a national icon, and flyers have been eagerly waiting to see it in the skies again."

The revival plan envisages starting operation with 30 aircraft within six months from the approval of the plan by NCLT.

EU Opens Antitrust Probe into Google's Use of Ad Tech

EU probe increases scrutiny of Google's role brokering digital ads across the internet

London: European Union regulators have launched a fresh antitrust investigation of Google, this time over whether the US tech giant is stifling competition in digital advertising technology. The European Commission said Tuesday that it has opened a formal investigation into whether Google violated the bloc's competition rules by favouring its own online display advertising technology services at the expense of rival publishers, advertisers and advertising technology services.

The commission, the EU's executive arm and the bloc's top antitrust enforcer, is looking in particular at whether Google is restricting access by third parties to user data for ad purposes on websites and apps.



"Thousands of European businesses use our advertising products to reach new customers and fund their websites every single day," Google said in a prepared statement. "They choose them because they're competitive and effective. We will continue to engage constructively with the European Commission to answer their questions and demonstrate the benefits of our products to European businesses and consumers."

The investigation signals a renewed effort by Margrethe Vestager, the EU commission's competition chief and executive vice president for digital, to rein in Google's market power. She has already slapped Google with a total of 8.2 billion euros (now \$9.7 billion) worth of fines in three separate antitrust cases. There was criticism, however, that the fines were not much of a deterrent because the company could easily afford them.

"Online advertising services are at the heart of how Google and publishers monetise their online services," Vestager said. Google collects data to be used for targeted advertising while it also sells advertising space and acts as a middleman between online advertisers and publishers, she said. AP

Tesla Unveils Supercharging Route Along China's Famed Silk Road



Beijing:

 Tesla Inc. has unveiled what it claims is the longest supercharging route in China, a 5,000-kilometre stretch spanning the vast nation from east to west that's studded with 27 electric-car charging stations along the way.

A promotional video about the route, which also pays homage to China's majestic landscape, was retweeted by CEO Elon Musk. Charging facilities are vital to the promotion of electric cars, with range anxiety one of the main reasons why people don't want to make the switch away from gasoline vehicles.

The route covers nine cities, starting from the eastern coastal hub of Zhoushan and stretching to the western city of Horgos bordering Kazakhstan. It loosely follows the same path as the legendary Silk Road, a network of trade routes that for centuries was central to economic, cul-

tural, political and religious interactions. Tesla drivers will be able to travel to tourist attractions including the Kumtag Desert, the Turfan volcano and Sayram Lake, famous scenic destinations in Xinjiang, all without worrying about their cars losing power.

China is critical to Tesla, which has a factory in Shanghai and sells thousands of cars there every month. Tesla has already set up around 840 charging stations in China and more than 65,000 supercharging poles covering over 310 cities. Now there will be one charging station every 100 km to 300 km along the Silk Road and drivers can charge their cars to run for up to 250 km in a single go in just 15 minutes. No Covid Cases Detected, N Korea to WHO

Seoul: North Korea has told the World Health Organisation it tested more than 30,000 people for the coronavirus through June 10 but has yet to find a single infection. The WHO said in a monitoring report Tuesday that North Korea's testing figures included 733 people who were tested during June 4-10, of which 149 were with influenza-like illnesses or severe respiratory infections.



Experts widely doubt North Korea's claim that it has not had a single case of the virus, given its poor health infrastructure and porous border with China, its major ally and economic lifeline.

Describing its anti-virus efforts as a "matter of national existence," the North has banned tourists, jettisoned diplomats and severely restricted cross-border traffic and trade. The self-imposed lockdown has caused further strain on an economy already battered by decades of mismanagement and crippling US-led sanctions over the country's nuclear weapons programme.

North Korean leader Kim Jong Un during a political conference last week called for officials to brace for prolonged Covid-19 restrictions, indicating that the country isn't ready to open its borders anytime soon. AP

TO TAKE A CALL DEPENDING ON MARKET CONDITIONS

Mall Operators Look to Revisit Rental Deals Every Month

New Delhi: Mall operators are planning to take the call on rent reliefs to tenants depending on the market condition every month, even as retailers have threatened to shut their shops in the malls of the National Capital Region for two days this week seeking a lenient and quick decision on rentals.

Also, reliefs this time around may not be as generous as last year, as malls say they are witnessing a quicker recovery after the easing of Covid restrictions this time compared with the unlock in 2020.

"For example, if I have given a revenue-sharing option to PVR this month and next



month, I will see how the business is going and we will decide around the 15th or 20th of July on what the rent should be," said Abhishek Bansal, director of Pacific Mall in West Delhi.

This is a departure from the strategies last year when malls announced quarterly slabs of rental reliefs for almost nine months well in advance. This year they will take a call every month based on the performances of the businesses.

In Delhi, malls are already witnessing sizeable crowds, thanks to the government's decision to open all stores, restaurants and movie halls almost in one go unlike last year when it took months for multiplexes and food joints to reopen, mall operators sa-

id. The Ambience Group said its two malls in South Delhi and Gurgaon attracted almost 60% of the pre-pandemic footfalls over the weekend.

"It took us three-four months last year to recover. So whatever footfalls last year we got after 70-75 days of reopening, this year we are already experiencing that kind of footfalls after 20 days of reopening," said Arjun Gehlot, director of Ambience.

According to mall operators, judging by the recovery so far, they might not need to offer much concessions to retailers this time.

However, retailers disagree that footfalls and sales are rebounding faster.

"The number of people and footfalls are actually contentious," said Nikhil Mohan, founder of menswear brand Blackberrys, who plans to shut his 15 stores in Delhi NCR malls as part of protests.

Dozens of retailers including Aditya Birla Fashion, Arvind, Puma, Biba, Global Desi and Lacoste have threatened to shut their shops at malls in NCR on Thursday and Friday to protest against what they termed delays in getting rental reliefs from the shopping centres. ET reported on Tuesday.

'Demand for 2-wheelers to Come from Urban Markets'

New Delhi: Urban markets will drive sales of motorcycles and scooters in the next few months as more states ease lockdown restrictions, helping the segment post growth in the ongoing financial year, a top executive at Honda Motorcycle & Scooter India (HMSI) said.

Two-wheeler sales in the local market have declined by nearly a third in the last two years on the back of a broader slowdown in the economy and the impact of the coronavirus pandemic.

Sales fell 18% to 17.42 million units in fiscal 2020, and again by 13% to 15.1 million units in the last financial year ended March 31, 2021.

HMSI, India's second-largest two-wheeler maker, is witnessing a spurt in demand as markets reopen after the easing of Covid-19 restrictions, sales and marketing director Yadvinder Singh Guleria told ET. "In urban areas, sales are recovering sharply... We see a spurt in sales with offices opening up, even with a restricted workforce."
